The line was just a touch light as the NO rock just brushed against a guard and spilled out, sealing the Manitoba 6 - 5 win. The men's action resumed Thursday in the early afternoon, when east coast collided with west coast as Alberta and New Brunswick went head to head. Great shots were made by both rinks, but Alberta was able to walk away with a 5 - 2 win. In a battle of the territories, the men from the Northwest Territories came out gunning and secured their first win with a 7 - 2 victory over Yukon. Saskatchewan

put together a fantastic eighth end to take two and force their game against Nova Scotia to an extra end. The men from CFB Halifax dug in deep, however, and were able to get the point in the ninth to secure the win 6 - 5. At the same time, Ontario and Newfoundland had a great match brewing at the Charlottetown club. Ontario was down one with the hammer heading into the eighth end. Newfoundland, looking for their first win, were able to bury a rock at the top four behind a row of staggered guards. Ontario skip Van Huysse, with his first stone, had only one way into the house and that was to throw a perfect raise on one of his guards to lie one on the button - which he delivered. Not looking for the extra end, skip Van Huysse went for the victory with his last rock, attempting to freeze to the shot rock and sit

two. His aim was good, but his weight was a touch heavy as he bumped his shot rock to the back four. The official was called out to measure the four foot to see whose rocks were closer and if Ontario had won, forced an extra end or lost. The official walked out for the measure, checked
