## HURRY HARD!



Thursday night brought some great action to the rinks at Charlottetown and Cornwall... and you can be sure The Dominion Daily was there taking notes!

The Nunavut women got their first win of the competition after beating Newfoundland 10 - 3. Manitoba continued their winning ways, thanks to a great team effort in their win over the Northwest Territories, 9 - 1. And after a late charge by the Yukon, New Brunswick was able to hold onto the match for an 8 - 6 win.

In the men's late draws, we had Ontario remaining undefeated with their 8 - 2 win over Quebec. PEI couldn't catch up to Sas-

katchewan in their duel; after the boys from the prairies jumped out to an early 5 - 1 lead, the Islanders lost the match 3 - 7.

Across town, New Brunswick and Yukon put on a great curling display at the Cornwall club. After trading the lead all night long, New Brunswick was able to score 3 in the final end to score the 9 - 7 victory.

Friday's early draw saw Quebec beat Nunavut 10 - 2, while the Nova Scotia and PEI battled down came to skip stones as the two were tied 5 - 5 in the eighth end. Nova Scotia curled a great end and were able to lie one on the four foot behind two

guards. PEI's skip tried to set up a run back to remove the Nova Scotia rock from the house, but unfortunately the angle just wasn't there and the run back attempt went wide of its mark. Yukon, meanwhile, was able to force their match with British Columbia to an extra end, but the boys from BC wouldn't let victory escape their grasp as they scored the point in the extra end to win the match 5 - 4.

On the woman's side, Yukon beat British Columbia 12 - 3, and PEI simply ran out of ends after stealing points in the seventh and eighth ends, as they fell to Nova Scotia 5 - 4. The Saskatchewan la-

dies had it in tough against Newfoundland, with the score tied heading into the eighth at six a piece. Newfoundland had a great end setup, laying one behind a guard, when skip Pam Osbourne setup for her last shot to throw a second guard and close any holes Saskatchewan could come through. Unfortunately Pam's stone over-curlled its mark and left a rock width port for Saskatchewan to try and squeeze through with a perfect hit to score three in the final end and walk away with the 9 - 6 win. The semi-finals and finals are almost upon us! We'll see you there!

Presented by Jim Waite (National and Olympic Curling Coach for Canada) and Leigh Armstrong (Canadian Mixed Champion) – with assistance from PEI's best elite curlers, including members of Team O'Rourke and Scotties runner-ups – and taking place on Sunday morning at 9:30am, the clinic will include both on ice work and a look at the latest high-tech offerings from the coaches at the Canadian Curling Association. On ice work is set to include a focus on line of delivery, fault analysis, drills, brushing, release,

and other technical skills. This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to hone your technique with some of Canada's curling greats. Also on deck is a look at the findings of two Olympic curling studies, as well as those of a sweeping study at the University of Western Ontario. Already a hit at the London Breast Cancer Bonspiel and a number of high-performance camps, the presentation's highlights will include a chance to check out the new brush heads used by Cheryl Bernard at the 2010 Olympics. The celebrity curling clinic is open to just 40 curlers. If interested, be sure to sign up with your Player Liaison – the clinic is almost full, but there is a waiting list...
